

Port Jervis Lynchers Not Indicted.

NEWBURG, N. Y., Sept. 29.—The Orange County Grand Jury reported to-day to Judge John J. Beattie. They said they had not indicted the Port Jervis lynchers of the colored man Robert Lewis. The reason was that the Port Jervis people had failed to give the evidence necessary to indict.

The Grand Jury then presented a long written statement concerning the affairs of the absconded County Treasurer, William M. Murray of Goshen, showing a deficiency in the poor fund of \$825, in the general fund of \$214, and in the Supreme Court fund of \$2,726. In addition to these deficiencies the Grand Jury found that his administration had been in many, if not in most, respects in direct violation of the law bearing upon the subject.

Several recommendations are made, one being that the Supervisors in future make a more thorough examination of the County Treasurer's books and accounts.
